Answer ALL parts of Question 1 in Section A and ONE question from Section B

SECTION A

You must answer ALL parts of this question.

1. a) What point is the cartoonist trying to make in **source A**? Use the details in the source to explain your answer. [2]
- b) Study **sources B and C**.
 - i) In what ways do they differ about the impact of the zeppelin raids? [2]
 - ii) How can you explain these differences? [2]
- c) Study **source D** and consider carefully who has produced it. How far do you trust source D's conclusion that 'the great bulk of the working classes are in a much worse position than before the war'? [3]
- d) How far do you agree that living conditions for all civilians grew worse during the course of the War? You may refer to material in the introductory paragraph provided at the start of this question. Use as many of the sources as you can. The best responses will also offer an evaluation of two or three of the sources i.e. the answer will address reliability. [10]

SECTION B

You must answer ONE question from this section. Each is worth 20 marks. Pay close attention to spelling and grammar.

2. Which periods of history do you think all schoolchildren in England aged 12-13 should learn about in school, and why? Explain your answer with precise examples.
3. Why have some rulers had great success and others encountered great failure? Illustrate your answer with reference to one successful ruler and one ruler who encountered failure.
4. Choose one historical source that you have studied or one historical site that you have visited and explain how it helped you as an historian to understand the past. (The source may be written – e.g. diary, book, newspaper etc. Or, it may be in the form of a photograph, painting, building, or other artefact; the site may be a battlefield or place of general historical importance.)
5. History is very popular in the media. What makes a good TV history programme? Illustrate your answer with examples.

6. What skills are required for an historian to understand the past? Explain your answer using examples from your own study of history.
7. Choose any empire that you have studied. What were the reasons for its rise?
